## 9. 2005 State Aerie Convention

This year's State Aerie Convention was held in Ithaca. The opening session Speakers were: Chief of Police Lauren Signer, NYS Police Captain Larry Jackman, Acting Ithaca Mayor Maria Coles.

## 10. STATE AERIE BY-LAWS voted on at the 2005 State Aerie Convention.

PROPOSED CHANGE NO. 1 This change reduces the state convention from three days to two days. PROPOSED CHANGE NUMBER ONE WAS DEFEATED.

PROPOSED CHANGE NO. 2 With the reduction of membership some Aerie's have less then 50 members in them. This by-law change would ensure that they continue to have a voice, no matter what size Aerie they belong to. This would give each Aerie one vote for every 50 members. PROPOSED CHANGE NUMBER TWO WAS APPROVED.

PROPOSED CHANGE NO. 3 & 4 This change would reduce the numbers of State Trustees from 5 to 3. PROPOSED CHANGE NUMBER THREE WAS DEFEATED.

PROPOSED CHANGE NO. 5 The State Secretary term was reduced from 3 years to 1 year. PROPOSED CHANGE NUMBER FIVE WAS APPROVED.

PROPOSED CHANGE NO. 6 This change is just a house keeping change. The current by-laws state unless you're Aerie sends you to the State Convention as a delegate; you cannot run for State Aerie Office. PROPOSED CHANGE NUMBER SIX WAS APPROVED.

PROPOSED CHANGE NO. 7 & 8 This entire section is to be removed. The position of State Legal Advisor is removed from the by-laws. PROPOSED CHANGE NUMBER SEVEN WAS APPROVED.

PROPOSED CHANGE NO. 9 New Section 9.3 "Any and all additions, deletions and/or modifications to the New York State Aerie by-laws that are to be voted on for approval at the annual New York State convention must be written into the minutes of said annual Spring Conference. In addition, any proposed additions, deletions and/or modifications to the New York State Aerie by-laws must be mailed to the secretary of each local New York State Aerie with a post mark that is no later than May 1<sup>st</sup> of that year."

MEMO OF SUPPORT This practice will follow that of the Grand Aerie who currently distributes in advance all the planned additions, deletions and/or modifications to the Grand Aerie statutes. This was submitted by the Saratoga Aerie #2586 PROPOSED CHANGE NUMBER Nine WAS APPROVED.
