WHAT IS A MINI GRAND PRIX?

The term “Grand Prix” refers to a style of automobile racing that is typically held on the streets of major cities throughout the world. These courses are comprised of a series of bends and hairpin turns that place a premium on maneuverability and acceleration. The race course for the Mini Grand Prix will be at the Depew Eagles Aerie. The NASCAR-style cars, which have high-style fiberglass bodies, are powered by 5.0 HP Tecumseh gasoline-powered engines that can achieve top speeds of 20-25 mph.

WHO PARTICIPATES . . . WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

5-10 Aerie's / Auxiliary's sponsored mini-cars will participate in the 2006 Mini Grand Prix. Mini car sponsors will donate \$1000 to sponsor a car. All mini-cars for 2006 will be purchased through Midwestern Racing Products, a leading manufacturer of racing mini-cars. Midwestern has specially designed the Mini Grand Prix car for this event.

Mini-car sponsors will receive:

- One mini-car
- An approved racing helmet
- An attractive plaque commemorating your participation in the Mini Grand Prix
- Space for banners around the track perimeter

WHO CAN DRIVE? WHAT CONSTITUTES A TEAM? HOW COMPETITIVE IS THE RACE?

A team consists of five people. At least two members must be drivers because the race rules require at least one driver change per heat. Team members who are not drivers will be considered members of the Pit Crew. All team members must be at least 18 years old. While the race is intended to be competitive, it's also expected to be fun! Let's all remember why we're doing this in the first place – it's a fundraiser! Safety is of paramount importance. **All cars must remain in stock condition – no modifications are permitted except for those named in the Rules and Regulations.**

HOW IS THE RACE CONDUCTED?

There will be three races (all three with pit stop, driver and tire change). The first race at 9 AM is a race against the clock. The second race is an elimination with two cars on the track at a time. The third race is with all cars. Those finishing last in the other races have the front spots. Again, each race requires a pit stop in which a tire and driver change are required.

INSURANCE

The Depew Aerie has a \$1,000,000 insurance policy which will cover everyone for race day. The policy does not cover damage to your mini-car. **Any individual who is permitted entry within the course perimeter is expected to sign an indemnification form, as well. All car sponsors are required to sign a waiver releasing the Eagles, all the sponsors of the race, the race, the race sanctioning body and the race site from any liability.**

CAR NUMBERS/DECALS

You will be contacted to confirm your car number. Car numbers must be clearly marked on front and both sides of your car. Although duplication of car numbers is allowed (because the race is being electronically scored and timed) it is not encouraged. We do, however, recognize that teams have special regard for certain numbers and duplication of numbers may occur. The Arthritis Foundation decal will be provided for each car sponsor and must be on the car for all race activities

OUTFITTING YOUR TEAM

Outfitting your crew can be fun and add to the excitement of race day. Outfitting can range from the same colored pants and shirt to coveralls with your company logo. **Long pants are required and drivers must wear long sleeves.** Remember, to be judged for the Team Uniform Contest, you must wear the uniforms you plan to wear on race day to the Pre-Race Rally Party. Car sponsors can obtain outfits at any uniform store. Broadway Sporting Goods Company, Inc. is the official uniform provider for the Arthritis Foundation's Mini Grand Prix. Contact Broadway Marketing at 489-3326 for uniform information.

TECHNICAL MODIFICATIONS

Members of our technical team will inspect cars on race day morning. Please make sure your car is LEGAL. All mini-cars are to be raced in stock condition. **NO ENGINE MODIFICATIONS ARE ALLOWED.** If you have any questions regarding what you can or cannot do either refer to the rules and regulations section of this handbook or contact Brian McDonald at 456-1203.

Fuel will not be provided on race day. Each team is responsible for supplying its own fuel. We will be checking fuel to make sure it is not tainted with illegal substances. Basically, you can use regular unleaded or super unleaded gasoline. You should come to race day with your mini-car in good shape – the body should be in good shape, your car should look good and be free of mechanical problems (remember, you are representing your company.) If you experience mechanical problems on race day, our tech people help you if they are free. One of your pit crew members should have some kind of mechanical expertise. No cars will be allowed to race if they are not in compliance with specifications.

All mini-cars will be inspected by our tech team in the paddock area on race day morning. All teams should plan on having their cars in the paddock area ready for inspection by 7:00am on race day. This way, we can get the inspections out of the way early and give teams a chance to do some practice laps on the course. **MAXIMUM RPM'S FOR THIS YEAR'S RACE ARE 3500. NO EXCUSES. IF YOU ARE OVER 3500 RPM'S AT THE CONCLUSION OF A RACE (RANDOM CHECKS WILL BE DONE) YOU WILL BE DQ'D FROM THAT RACE.** A Sendec digital tachometer will be provided for each mini-car (teams will be billed for these) and must be placed on the car.

For 2006, we are mandating that each mini-car be equipped with an inverted U rollbar. While we will be supplying each team with these items, it should be noted that you will be billed for these items. Please do not make any modifications to your car! The only modifications allowed are those stated in the rules and regulations section of this handbook. We want to make the race fair, safe and most of all fun for everyone. The key to winning the Mini Grand Prix should be the skill of the driver and the speed of the Pit Crew, NOT who can "cheat" the best! We are only able to obtain insurance to conduct this race by adhering to these rules. The #1 priority is your safety. **Please be sure to bring your own gasoline, oil and tools for race day.**

TIRE CHANGING CONTEST

The Tire Changing Contest will take place at the Pre-Race Rally Party. Teams will change the right rear tire (opposite tire from the drive tire.) It is required that each car sponsor bring their own tire jack. Please keep in mind that tire jacks must be a **simple mechanical device** (no pneumatic or electrical devices are permitted.) The device must elevate the rear tire. Many car sponsors use a two-wheel dolly for their car jack. Teams will start from a designated starting line and push their cars (with a driver in it) to a designated area approx. 15 yards away. Team will remove a lynch pin from the tire, remove the tire and replace it with another tire. The lynch pin must then be securely replaced. The car is then pushed to a designated finish line. All team members must have a hand on the car at all times and must cross the finish line. A trophy will be awarded to the top finisher in the contest. **Participants are asked not to drink alcohol before and during the competition.** Two teams will compete in each heat. Both will be timed by our officials. Heats will continue until all teams have competed. Teams that wish to attempt the tire change again will be given an opportunity to do so. After all teams have completed the competition, our officials will determine the winner. The winner is the team with the lowest recorded time.

BEST LOOKING CAR CONTEST

In order to compete in the Best Looking Car contest, all cars must have the require stickers/logos displayed on their car (Arthritis Foundation logo.) All cars must comply with the car modification guidelines (see Rules and Regulations section for specific guidelines.) Cars will be judged and a trophy will be awarded. All mini-cars will be on display in the service bay area. All Pre-Race Rally party guests will receive a ballot form when they register and will vote for their favorite car design.

TEAM UNIFORM CONTEST RULES

In order to compete in the team uniform contest, team members **MUST** wear the racing uniforms they will be wearing on race day. Team uniforms will be judged and a trophy will be awarded. All Pre-Race Rally party guests will receive a ballot form when they register and will vote for their favorite team uniforms.

BANNERS

Each Aerie and or Auxiliary sponsor will have the opportunity to display multiple banners along the inside of the Mini Grand Prix track. Banners should be no longer than 10 feet and no higher than 3 feet. **Your responsible for removing the banner after the race and taking it with you.**

DRIVER/CREW PARKING AND REGISTRATION

Driver/Pit Crew registration will begin at 7:00am. A packet containing all your team information will be waiting for you at the Registration Table located in the Paddock Area. Please assign one team member to pick up your registration packet. It will contain your team ID's for race day, your wrist bands for the V.I.P. Tent and other important information.

All race team members should report to the Paddock area at 8:00am for a Team Meeting with our Race Officials. Rules and Regulations will be reviewed at this time. It is very important that all team members are present for this meeting.

IMPOUND AREA

After each heat, cars will be required to enter the impound area, which is located inside the Paddock Area. No more than two members from each team are allowed in the impound area to bring their car for inspection.

TEAM MEMBER NAMES

We **MUST** have the names of your 5 team members and two paddock team members by August 15th if you want them to be listed in the race program. A team member form is included in this handbook.

DRIVER RELATIONS

Throughout race day, we will have our Registration/Information Booth located in the Paddock Area for Driver Relations. Any questions regarding the race, grid positions, problems with your car, complaints, etc. should be handled in this area. A race steward and volunteers will be stationed there to answer your questions.

PIT ROW

Complete instructions for the Pit Row area are located in section (J) of the Rules and Regulations.

Team members not driving their car are considered Pit Crew members.

Pit Crew members are not allowed to walk on the track when the cars are on the track. Prior to each race, the pit crew members may walk on the track to pit row. When the first car is on the track, any crew member not in pit row will be required to walk outside the track to gain entrance to the pit area.

Each pit crew is encouraged to make a "pit board" or sign with your company name, race number, etc. This will signal your driver that you want him/her to make a pit stop. Only one person is allowed in front of the pit area and then only to signal the driver to make a pit stop. All other pit crew members must remain behind the pit area. **Drivers must exit from the right side of their car while in pit row!**

Pit Observers will be assigned to pit row to confirm that a tire change and driver change has been made. The pits will be closed for the first 5 laps of each heat and each race.

RACE DAY PROGRAMS

Race Day programs will be printed for distribution on race day. The programs will include the names of each car sponsor, ads for each sponsor, an outline of the day's activities and information about the Mini Grand Prix. All sponsors will receive a complimentary ad in the program. All program ads must be submitted to the Arthritis Foundation office no later than August 25th. If we do not receive an ad from you, we will do our best to put something together for you (time permitting.)

B. THE RACE

1. The start will be a rolling start in rows of two behind the pace car. The pole position is the inside position with respect to the first turn. At the end of the pace lap, the pace car will enter the pits and the drivers will enter into the front straight. All pace laps will be under yellow flag with no passing until the green flag. If a car falls out during the parade laps, it will go to the rear of the starting grid.
2. Each car will race in a number of preliminary heats and a consolation or championship race.
3. The starting position for the heats will be drawn randomly by the officiating committee. This will ensure that each car has the opportunity to race against different cars throughout the day.
4. Should a car drop out of the race after the grid has been established, but before the race has begun, all cars will be moved in numerical order of starting positions to fill the vacant position.
5. The results from the initial heats will determine the starting positions for the championship heat ("A" Main) and consolation heats "D," "C," and "B" Mains) This emphasizes the importance of taking care of your mini-car and equipment during the day, so as to be capable of racing in one of these heats. If you can't race, you can't win; or as the proverbial rule of racing goes, "If it breaks, you get to keep both pieces."
6. There must be **at least one driver change** during **each heat** and each race. **The right rear tire** must be changed **during each heat** and race. The driver and tire change may be accomplished during the same pit stop. The rear end of the car must be lifted from the ground by a simple mechanical device (no pneumatic or electric devices are allowed) when changing the tire. The cotter (or hitch) pin must be removed from the car and then securely re-inserted.
7. RAIN POLICY... Due to the charitable nature of this event, no refunds will be issued in the event of inclement weather. Should it rain on race day we still plan to race. If rain persists and does not allow the race to take place on Saturday, Sept. 9, the Mini Grand Prix will be held on Sunday, September 10. If less than half the heats have been conducted on Saturday, Sept. 9, Sunday's schedule will be exactly the same and we will begin the races as they were originally scheduled. Any existing times/scores from Saturday will be erased.

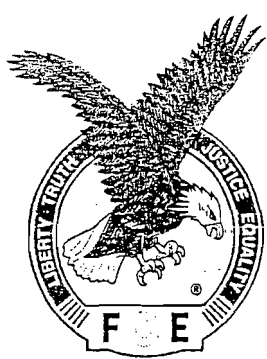


